How We Have Helped

In the 3 months between 1st July and 30th September 2017, we worked intensively with 120 individual families, having a positive impact on the lives of 236 children. Our Redhill Children's Centre also supported an additional 343 families.



The impact on families measured using Family Outcome Star Plus, shows that 81% of families reported an improvement as a result of Welcare's intervention during the past year.

A Young Family Helped by Welcare

Across our services we help young people, parents and families with an holistic approact tailoring a package of support that suits them and their needs. Here we share the story single mother, Ada, and her 3 sons, Dawud, Ade and Jojo.

Ada was referred to Welcare by the Safeguarding Officer at one of her children's schools. Both her eldest and youngest sons have complex needs, including Crohn's disease, ADHD and autism, and they attend schools for children with additional needs. Her middle son, Ade, attends mainstream school but has learning difficulties and behaviour problems.

Ada recently suffered the loss of both of her parents and was grieving. In addition, he own health was poor and she had many hospital appointments to attend. The family he very little support and few social networks to offer support and respite from the demands of family life.

At Welcare, Ada and her sons were assigned a Family Support Worker, who worked alongside other agencies to ensure greater professional support and to help increase engagement by the family. Together with the family, specific objectives were set that would enable them to move foward to a more positive future.

Welcare matched Ade with a Volunteer Mentor to support him with his English so he could achieve his ambition to study carpentry at college. We also arranged for a Volunteer Family Helper to assist Ada with completing household tasks that were pilin up and to complete paperwork applying for the benefits the family were entitled to.

Welcare's Family Support Worker signposted Ada to agencies that could offer relevant information, such as the Children's Disability Team and a local trust, and provided information on various social activities and clubs for the boys, including Army Cadets, swimming and local youth clubs. She also contacted CAMHS (Children and Adolescent Mental Health Service) on behalf of the family to ensure Ade would receive the help a support needed.

Welcare's Family Support Worker liaised with Occupational Health and the family's Housing Association to ensure a new shower unit was installed in their home, making a vital difference for Jojo, who required showers due to his Crohn's disease.

Although Ada has continuing health needs, Welcare has helped to empower the family helping to establish an excellent local support network and signposting to agencies the enable them to have a more positive future.

Update on our Greenwich Centre

Following the news that our grant from the Royal Borough of Greenwich was being discontinued in December 2016, we have focused on generating funding and support to launch our Child & Family Support Service at our Greenwich Centre in the high-need Nightingale Vale area in Woolwich Arsenal. Our central staff and Greenwich Centre Manager have been working hard to network, attend key meetings, apply for relevant funding opportunities and maintain a strong presence in the Royal Borough of Greenwic We have secured three years' funding from the William Wates Memorial Trust totalling £23,829 to deliver MySpace courses and have been given a sustainability grant by the local council with the support of Councillor David Gardner. We are currently awaiting t outcome of a number of funding applications. As part of our commitment to continuing provide a local service, *MySpace* in Greenwich will commence in January 2018.

Save Greenwich Centre Crowdfunding Campaign

This November we will be launching a crowdfunding campaign to help contribute to the fundraising for our Child and Family Support Service at our Greenwich centre. Crowdfunding is the practice of funding a project or venture by raising money from a large number of people who each contribute a relatively small amount, typically via the Internet.

We will aim to raise £20k through this new and exciting initiative for Welcare. We hope all our supporters can help us achieve this in any way they can - by donations large or small, by sharing the page link on social media or by talking about it to any and everyower work information will be shared very soon.

Redhill's New Children's Garden

Councillor Roger Newstead, Mayor of Reigate & Banstead, officially opened a new all-weather play area at Welcare's Redhill Children's Centre on Wednesday 12th July.

Hundreds of children have used the new all-weather garden since it opened. The garden will meet the needs of the many local families who do not have access to a garden or safe outdoor play space. It also offers outside multi-sensory play areas specially designed to meet the needs of children with disabilities.

Outside play helps to prevent childhood obesity and vitamin D deficiency, as recently highlighted in the British Medical Journal (16 February 2017.) This is particularly important locally, as Year 6 children in Reigate and Banstead have obesity levels which are nearly 2% higher than the Surrey average. As well as its importance for physical development, playing



outdoors also helps to build language and communication skills, which in turn promote social and emotional development.

Play equipment includes chimes, drum panels, a Mud Kitchen, Fairy Dinosaur Land, two "make your own den" areas and a 2 metre by 2 metre sand pit. Using recycled materials such as tyres, logs, planks of wood and old CDs, we kept costs down. Much of the construction work was done by amazing volunteers, including young people on the National Citizenship Scheme and a team from Employability.

Our grateful thanks go to the following funders without whom this garden project coulc not have happened: John Wates, Sue Wooderson, The Raven Housing Trust and Councill Jonathan Essex from his Members' Allocation Fund, as well as additional donors who wi to remain anonymous. A huge thank you also to everyone who gave their time and effort to help us turn this dream into a reality, whether it be by digging, painting, delivering, praying or providing tea and coffee!
