In the 6 months to the end of September 2015 we worked intensively with 76 individual families, impacting on 158 children.

Big Lottery Funding Awarded to Welcare

We are so thrilled to announce that we have been awarded a four year grant by the Big Lottery Reaching Communities Fund for the

development of our Child and Family Support Services. After a long application process Chief Executive, Anna Khan, returned from annual leave to receive a call from their grants officer giving us the good news!

This funding enables us to re-launch our child and family support services in the inner London boroughs of Lambeth and Southwark providing a range of practical and emotional help to vulnerable parents and their children up to the age of 13. Not only do we know how great the need for our services are in this area, but Welcare has a strong history of working as an inner London organusation so we are looking forward to be able to expand our support to those that need us in the area.

We have also been awarded a grant to employ a Family Support Worker in Bromley to help develop and expand the role of volunteers in the borough. The additional support given by our growing volunteer base allows us to reach a greater number of children and families impacted by domestic abuse, poverty,

"The flexibility. You can choose your hours and your days and how often you work - once a week, once a month" Pat actually volunteers three times a week for us!

How Eva Found Her Voice

Eva came to us aged nine years old from a very volatile, unstable background. Her mother, Ruth, had moved the family away from an abusive home environment to a new area so they could start a new life for themselves. At home Eva appeared to be content and happy. However at school it was a different story, where Eva was shy and quiet, and rarely shared her emotions.

With mum, Ruth's, approval, Eva's school arranged for her to take part in Welcare's MySpace course, held at her school. Our MySpace community group work programme aims not just to explore the issues of witnessing domestic abuse during the 12 week programme but to make a long-lasting impact. In the group, she was given the opportunity to be heard and to share her experiences with other children who had been through the same things as her. Eva was much more vocal and responsive in her MySpace group than she was during school time, and clearly showed the need to discuss, process and understand the negative experiences she had endured.
