With International Women's Day on Monday and Mothering Sunday just around the corner, we are celebrating the vital contribution of our female staff and supporters. Over 90% of our dedicated staff are women and I am incredibly proud of their hard work and flexibility in providing practical and emotional support to families in need.

Many of you have heard me talk about the origins of Welcare founded in 1894 when the problems faced by young women were about survival in a society where their very place was circumscribed by their gender and where pregnancy and single motherhood combined with poverty pushed them to the margins of society. It was this need that was



recognised by visionary and compassionate Christians and the 'Diocesan Association for the Care of Friendless Girls' was founded amplifying the voices calling for a practical response to poverty and inequality in South London and East Surrey. We continue their legacy today and this is why I am sharing a feature on our practical response and recent Families In Crisis Appeal. In this issue of the newsletter, we have also highlighted our partnership with two schools in Bromley to support families.

One of the privileges of my role is getting to know our long-standing and incredibly committed supporters. All have had interesting and full lives combined with public and community service. On behalf of everyone involved in our work I include a tribute to Reverend Jean Griffiths who died in February and share with you just some of the ways our supporters (including the men!) have continued to generate income and fellowship throughout this most extra-ordinary year.
